**Report on the use of Pupil Premium Funding 2016-2017**

**Pupil Premium Allocation**

Total Number of Pupils on Roll (January 2016)	560
Number of Pupils eligible for Pupil Premium (January 2016 Census)	241

Total Amount of Pupil Premium Received (2016-17)	£318,420

Pupil Premium funding comes directly into school and is based on the number of children registered as eligible for Free School Meals (FSM) at the moment and in the past six years.

It should be noted that not all children eligible for FSM are low attaining or making poor progress. We had to consider how to support the learning of some high attaining children in addition to those who had barriers to learning.

We plan to evaluate the impact of the how we have used our Pupil Premium allocation. If the impact is positive we will continue to use the money to improve the quality of provision.

In addition, we plan to:

- Further develop the Early Years outdoor learning provision
- Further develop School Pets corner
- Improve and resource Reading books throughout school
- Subscribe to First News & Magazines e.g. National Geographic for Kids.
- Further investment in activities for children to participate in during Breakfast Club.
- Allow children who do not have books at home to choose a selection which they can keep at home.
- Purchase iPads, Kindles and other devices which will be used to engage, support and extend learning
- Provide staff training focusing on quality nurture principles and strategies for supporting the well-being of pupils and staff.
- Provide 'Home Learning Kits' for children who don't have pens and paper at home
- Provide fruit and milk in KS2
- Provide nursery lunches
